To whom it may concern,

The Florida Association of Public Information Officers' (FAPIO) Deployment Team has a vital role in assisting with numerous disasters throughout the state and the southeastern United States.

Your public information officer has expressed an interest in participating with the FAPIO Deployment Team.

The purpose of this letter is to clearly illustrate the requirements and obligations of being a member of this team and allow you to make an informed and quick decision about releasing your employee for when a deployment is indicated:

- When the State Division of Emergency Management makes a request, the
 deployment team coordinator will contact your personnel directly with a
 request for activation. The member has three options to reply to the request:

 I am available;
 I am not available;
 I may be available but need to
 check with my employer first. Unless otherwise specified at the time of
 request, the team member is expected to be ready to deploy within two
 hours from the mission assignment.
- 2. Under certain circumstances a more rapid deployment may be deemed necessary by the State Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and authorized as a rapid activation. The time frame for this deployment is one hour.
- 3. The usual minimum deployment time is seven days. The team member will need to be self sufficient with food, water and transportation for a minimum of seven days.
- 4. When called, the team member will be provided with the type of emergency, incident location, deployment duration, the point of contact, the number of PIOs needed and *state tasking number*.

NOTE: No personnel can be deployed without a state tasking number. This number is an imperative part of the state's tracking system and reimbursement process. If a tracking number is not secured the mission is not authorized and the organization may not be eligible for reimbursement.

5. Every effort will be made to deploy team members who are located in the same region as the emergency however, this may not be possible if the entire region and the surrounding regions are affected. All team members deployed should be prepared to travel statewide if activated.

All team members should be familiar with both the State of Florida Public Information Officers Deployment Team Handbook, which can be accessed at http://www.ffca.org/FAPIO/PIODeploymentHandbook.pdf and the Statewide Emergency Response Plan (SERP), which can be accessed at www.ffca.org.

At this time we would ask that you sign this letter indicating your understanding of the member's obligations. In the event of a deployment the member must still obtain your permission to be deployed.
