Notes:	Early in the Surfside response, brought up the issue of mental wellness. Two individuals were identified and a Mental Wellness Group under the IMT EMS Branch. This was a collaborative effort between DOH, EMS, and the H&S Collaborative.
	Ended up with about 24 folks assigned to the Group including the IAFF Peer Support.
	Reviewed post-analysis document provided by the Group.
	Not only supported the first responders but the families of those missing.
	Lessons learned, start early with deploying resources.

Currently have 300 logins that provide user access to field collection tools for capturing field damage assessments, that can be seen on a common platform (ArcGIS)
